## Live It All Week

*Pre-K-K Take Home Paper for Families***What Your Child Learned Today**

Today your child learned that God provides us with wisdom. Through the writings of Solomon and the teachings and life of Jesus, we learn that God wants us to trust him and that he will show us how to act fairly, love mercy, and walk humbly with him. Your child learned several ways to show wisdom in everyday life and was encouraged to trust Jesus to guide them and help them as they grow in their faith.

**Try This**

Using small paper dolls or play figures, walk your child through several scenarios that would require wisdom. Possible scenarios might include: a child hurting other children on the playground; a child pulling the hair of someone in front of them; a child asking someone else to lie for them so they won't get in trouble, etc. In each case, guide your child in understanding how they can practice wisdom—to act fairly, love mercy, and walk humbly with God.

## Table Talk

- **Choose a few Proverbs to read at the table (e.g., Proverbs 22:1–2, 8–9, 22–23). Vote as a family for one to memorize. Read it together each day. On the last day of the week, see if anyone can recite it by themselves. Discuss how it helped your family love and live wisely this week.**

**Living in Wisdom: Justice and Mercy**

- Scripture: Proverbs 22:1–2, 8–9, 22–23
- Big Idea: God gives us wisdom. He tells us the right way to live: to act fairly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with him.
- Memory Verse: “The LORD has shown you what is good.” Micah 6:8a

## SOMETHING ELSE TO DO

Your child made a bird feeder today to help them practice giving freely (Proverbs 22:9). Help them hang the bird feeder in a place visible from a window. Read the Scripture on the feeder and reinforce to your child that God uses our hands to share his provision and love. If possible, encourage your child to watch the bird feeder with binoculars. (Consider borrowing some as needed.) Help them foster a love of mercy by talking with them about the fragility of the birds and God's tenderness in caring for them.
