#### Receiving Holy Communion in the Episcopal Church

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Bread and Wine of Holy Communion, the sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood. This is done by holding out your hands to receive the bread. To receive the wine guide the chalice to your lips, or dip the bread into the wine. You may choose not to receive the wine. If you do not wish to receive Communion or have not been bapitzed, you may come forward to receive a blessing from the priest. Please indicate this by folding your arms across your chest. Gluten-free wafers are available to those who need them, and are kept and administered separately from the other wafers. Please indicate your desire for a gluten-free wafer to the priest. If you have not been baptized and wish to be, please speak to one of the priests following the service.

If you are unable to come forward to receive Holy Communion, please notify an usher and the clergy will bring the sacrament to you in your pew.

#### he Epistle Lesson

#### 2 Peter 3:8-15a

Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a nousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. The Lord is not slow pout his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not anting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord ill come like a thief, and then the heaven's will pass away with a loud noise, nd the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything hat is done on it will be disclosed. Since all these things are to be dissolved i this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness nd godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, ecause of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the ements will melt with fire? Therefore, eloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him peace, without spot or blemish; and regard the patience of our Lord as

And people from the whole Judean countryside and all ne people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's air, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. e proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have aptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
